profit from the operation of the heat network.

On the 1st of October 2022, the Government announced wholesale energy prices are to be fixed for all non-domestic energy customers for a period of six months.

Your daily standing charge has increased to reflect changes in the supplier costs, and administrative costs. To ensure that Abbeyfield South Downs Limited continues to recover the actual costs of operating your heat network, your daily standing charge will increase by 2.18p/day from 8th June 2023. Abbeyfield South Downs have chosen to reduce the recommended unit rate by 8.39p/kwh which will be backdated from the date you moved in. As a result of this backdate, credits will soon be calculated and communicated to you in due course. Any credits will be calculated using individual metered consumption which will be

applied to your Guru prepayment system, and added as a credit to your balance on your in-home display. We will soon write to you outlining the calculations for the backdate charges.

Standard components of your heat tariff

Your **unit charge** covers the bulk cost of the energy generated in the communal plant room. It also includes any associated heat losses between the supply point and your home. Your energy consumption is measured via the heat meter installed in your home, so you only pay for what you have used. You are charged for every kilowatt-hour (kWh) consumed within your property.

Your daily standing charge

is the fixed charge passed on by your heat provider, which covers the cost of operating the heat network and delivering energy to your home. This is an annual fixed amount that is payable every day by all residents regardless of how much energy they use.

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
